She is currently the Huguenot Society of Georgia State President. Under her leadership, Georgia hosted a very successful National Congress in 2023 in Macon, Georgia. She has served as State Treasurer.

She was elected at the 2023 Continental Congress as an Honorary Vice President General for life in NSDAR. Joyce is a member of 14 lineage societies and has served in many positions for over 35 years.

When asked by NSDAR, Joyce has served at the National Level as Chair and Vice Chair of Development for several administrations and Advisor of Development. She has been on the Board of Trustees for Kate Duncan Smith DAR School and an advisor to Berry College and Crossnore.

As the State Regent of Georgia, her State Regent's Projects were; A master plan for the restoration of Meadow Garden, the historic home of George Waltonsigner of the Declaration of Independence, as to give each NSDAR School at least \$10,000.00; Berry College was the recipient of funding to restore the stained-glass windows in Berry's Frost Chapel and rebuild Miss Berry's historic summer gazebo; Hindman Settlement School received the funds to build and furnish the Directors new office; Crossnore received IPADS for their students and KDS received money for the Georgia Scholarship Fund.



Jacques' Salmon Fillet in Foil Hands on: 10 minutes Total time: 20 minutes

1 (6-ounce) salmon fillet, 1-inch thick 1/2 small zucchini, cut into 3-by-1/4-inch sticks 1/2 small carrot, cut into 3-byV-inch sticks 3 shiitake mushrooms, cut into 3-by-V-inch sticks 1 tablespoon unsalted butter

Serves:1

Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Lightly grease or butter a 12-by-12-inch piece of aluminum foil.

Carefully check the salmon for bones and remove them with tweezers or needle-nose pilers. Sprinkle the fillet with salt and pepper and place in the center of prepared foil. Arrange zucchini, carrots and mushrooms over fish. Sprinkle with

Arrange zucchini, carrots and mushrooms over fish. Sprinkle with salt and pepper, if desired. Top with butter. Fold foll over fish, meeting edges in the middle and folding over twice to seal. Seal side edges by folding over twice. Place foil packet on a small baking sheet and put fish into oven. Bake 10 minutes and remove from oven. Carefully open packet, avoiding the steam that will escape. Slide contents with sauce onto serving plate. Serve immediately.
