YOUTH CONTESTS

November 20: Closing date for current year Youth Contest Candidate Submissions.

Program Requirements - GO TO THE NHS "MEMBERS ONLY" TAB FOR DETAILS

- 1. Candidates must be students in either elementary school, middle school, or high school and <u>must be able to show Huguenot lineage</u>.
- 2. ALL SUBMISSIONS SHOULD CONTAIN The Youth's Name, Grade, Age, Address, proven lineage, and title. Attention should also be paid to spelling and grammar. If you are a junior member, show your current member # and lineage is not required.
- 3. Prepare your submissions in <u>Microsoft Word format</u> (or JPG format for the Level 1 submission) whenever possible; if not possible, use PDF. **Please email submissions** to Martha Ann Whitt at youth_contest@nationalhuguenotsociety.org between January 1st and **November 20th**.

Contest Topics and Prizes

Level 1 - Grades 2-4: Submit an art piece to illustrate the contributions of Huguenots or Huguenot descendants to America.

Prizes: 1st place=\$100; 2nd place=\$50; 3rd place=\$25.

Level 2 – Grades 5-8: Submit either: (1) An essay on "What it means to me to be a descendant of a Huguenot." Information about their specific ancestor may be cited. – OR – (2) Read and submit a review of one of the books listed on the NHS website.

Prizes: 1st place=\$200; 2nd place=\$100; 3rd place=\$50.

Level 3 - Grades 9-12: Submit essay on "What I've learned about the migration of Huguenots to other lands."

Prizes: 1st place=\$500; 2nd place=\$250; 3rd place=\$100.



NEW INSIGNIA

New insignia was approved to be purchased by NHS Congress "when funds become available".

First is the "New Member" Pin. A member may purchase 1 pin for each new member they sponsor to join the society. The pin is 3/4" x 3/4" and can be purchased with a lapel pin back or a charm loop. With the lapel pin back it can be worn on the insignia ribbon, lapel, or as a tie tack. With the charm loop, it can be worn on the insignia ribbon with a bow or branch bar, on a charm bracelet, or as a necklace. The cost including postage is \$35 and will be available through the NHS home office.

Second is the "Years of Service" Pin. The pin is available for purchase once the member reaches 10 years as a member of the Society and every 5 yr. thereafter. The pin is 1" x 1" and comes to the member unengraved. It is only worn on the insignia ribbon. The member can bridge gap years; AKA none contiguous if they need to drop out for a year or two.

There is no exchange program through National. A member or their family may donate old pins for resale. The member may resale their own pin. The cost including postage is \$20 and will be available through the NHS home office. continued

Third is the new "Past State President's"
Pin. Only available to past state
presidents, the pin is large at 2" x 1-1/8". It
comes to the member unengraved with an
engraving bar on the back. It is available
from the NHS office and must be
purchased by the State. Note: the picture
on the right shows gold letters, but the
actual letters are white.

The pin comes with a pin back and may be worn on the insignia ribbon or on an insignia bow on the insignia ribbon side.


The cost including postage is \$50, it is the only pin that comes standard in a gift box.
